REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY THE PANEL OF COMMISSIONERS CONCERNING THE THIRD INSTALMENT OF CLAIMS FOR SERIOUS PERSONAL INJURY OR DEATH (CATEGORY "B" CLAIMS)

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INTRODUCTION

- 1. This is the fourth report that the Panel of Commissioners appointed for claims in category "B" submits to the Governing Council of the United Nations Compensation Commission in accordance with article 37(e) of the Provisional Rules for Claims Procedure (the "Rules").1/
- This fourth report covers the 711 category "B" claims (third instalment) that were received by the Commission by 15 September 1995, which were found to meet all the formal requirements as stated in the Rules and, for the claims submitted after 1 January 1995, were accepted for filing by the Governing Council, and that were not included in previous instalments. It also covers the 309 claims from previous instalments where further documentation was requested by the Panel. This report is intended to complete the review of the category "B" claims except for claims that may be filed at a later date for serious personal injury/death resulting from mine explosions and claims that may be filed with respect to "missing" persons in Iraq or Kuwait, or detained persons in Iraq, who have been released or legally declared dead.²/
- 3. Applying the methodology determined by the Panel, the secretariat reviewed all of the claims that had not yet been presented to the Panel as well as all claims where further documentation had been requested. The secretariat made a preliminary assessment of each claim. The claims raising similar issues were grouped and samples were presented to the Panel. All claims where the secretariat's preliminary assessment would lead to a recommendation that no compensation be awarded were submitted to the Panel for its review on a country-by-country basis.
- 4. The claims in the third instalment were reviewed by the Panel at its session held from 16 to 20 October 1995. This session was held in Geneva at the headquarters of the secretariat and was conducted in private. Staff members of the secretariat attended the session of the Panel and provided support as required. When necessary, the Panel was aided by the medical expert appointed to provide assistance to the Panel and to the secretariat in the review of category "B" claims.
- 5. The principles established by the Panel in the first, $\frac{3}{2}$ / second $\frac{4}{2}$ / and third $\frac{5}{2}$ / reports, approved by the Governing Council in Decisions 20, $\frac{6}{2}$ / $26^{\frac{7}{2}}$ / and 27, $\frac{3}{2}$ / respectively, were applied to the claims in the third instalment. This fourth report does not raise any legal issues other than those addressed in the Panel's previous reports and should be read in conjunction with the latter.
- 6. In particular, this report covers claims recommended for compensation that are related to other claims where the maximum amount of US\$10,000.00 has already been awarded to family members who submitted claims in previous instalments. The Panel recalls that successful claimants whose claims are

reported hereby are entitled to receive compensation on an equal basis from the maximum amount awarded to family members in the previous instalments even though "zero" amounts have been stated with respect to their claims in the annexes attached to this report. 2/

7. The annexes to this fourth report list, by consolidated claim submission, the individual recommendations made by the Panel for each claim.

I. CLAIMS WHERE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION WAS REQUESTED

- 8. In the previous instalments the Panel had before it a number of claims for death where no proof of family relationship had been submitted. The Panel requested that the relevant Governments and international organizations provide additional documentation showing the family relationship between the claimant and the deceased. In other instances, the Panel deemed it necessary to receive more information regarding the identity of the claimant or the circumstances under which the serious personal injury or death occurred. In total, 309 such claims had been filed with the Commission by 19 Governments and one international organization.
- 9. Subsequent to the issuance of the Panel's second and third reports, seventeen Governments and one international organization submitted further documentation. Two Governments requested that one of the claims they had submitted be withdrawn. Two Governments did not file any additional documentation.

A. Claims in the first and second instalments where further documentation had been requested and was submitted

There were 179 claims in the first and second instalments where further documentation requested by the Panel was submitted. The secretariat examined these claims and presented them to the Panel along with a preliminary assessment. The Panel reviewed the claims and made its recommendations for the 179 claims that are listed in separate annexes. With respect to 131 claims, the Panel found that the documentation provided was satisfactory and recommended compensation. For 47 claims, the Panel did not recommend compensation since it found that either the documentation received was not satisfactory or that the information submitted indicated that the loss for which the claim had been filed was not directly linked to Iraq's invasion and occupation of Kuwait. The recommendations for each consolidated claim submission in which claims were supplemented by some documentation are as follows:

B. Claims in the first and second instalments where further documentation had been requested and was not submitted

11. The Panel took note that the secretariat sent letters to the Permanent Missions of the Governments concerned to recall that further documentation had been requested for a number of claims in the Panel's previous reports. In

these letters, given that the third instalment of category "B" claims was intended to be the last one, a deadline was set for the submission of the necessary documentation. Nevertheless, in a number of claims further documentation was not submitted. The Panel also noted that in a number of claims, the information provided was that, for various reasons, no further documentation would be made available.

- 12. The Panel reviewed the claims, where further documentation had been requested but was not submitted, as a separate grouping so as to ensure a global comprehension of the specificities or of the common features of these claims, if any.
- 13. The Panel recalls that it had requested further documentation in cases where claims would not have been recommended for compensation due to the scarcity or lack of evidence contained in the claims. The Panel therefore recommends that no compensation be awarded to a claim where the documentation requested had not been submitted by the time the Panel reviewed the claim again.

II. CLAIMS IN THE THIRD INSTALMENT

A. Overview of the claims

- 14. The claims in the third instalment are comprised of 711 claims submitted by 14 Governments and one international Organization. 19/
- 15. Based on its experience with the second instalment, where a number of claims required further documentation, the Panel had instructed the secretariat in advance to request Governments to provide further information for third instalment claims, if it was deemed necessary. Therefore, in cases where the preliminary assessment of a claim in the third instalment by the secretariat led to a request for additional information, the secretariat advised the submitting entity to obtain and submit the relevant documentation by a fixed deadline. The Panel made its recommendations for such claims on the basis of the information contained in the claims at the time that they were reviewed by the Panel.
- 16. The recommendations for each claim are contained in the annexes to this report. These annexes contain the claimant's name, the UNCC claim number, the national claim number, the deceased's or the injured person's name, and the Panel's recommendation for each element of the claim. Separate annexes list the claims for serious personal injury and the claims for death. The annexes are organized by consolidated claim submissions pursuant to article 37(e) of the Rules. The annexes are being provided to each respective Government or international organization separately due to their confidentiality.

B. Claims for which compensation is recommended

17. Out of 711 claims, the Panel recommends that compensation be awarded for 566 claims in the third instalment. As noted above, the recommendations on the claims are presented for each country by consolidated claim submission. The amounts of compensation with respect to each consolidated claim submission are as follows:

C. Claims for which no compensation is recommended

18. The Panel recommends that no compensation be awarded in 135 claims in the third instalment.

D. Claims transferred to the category "C" Panel of Commissioners ("transferred" claims)

19. The Panel requests that the Executive Secretary transfer 17 claims for mental pain and anguish in the third instalment to the Panel of Commissioners dealing with the category "C" claims, in accordance with article 32, paragraph 3 of the Rules.

E. Eligible claims for which no compensation is recommended at this stage ("suspended" claims)

20. The Panel "suspends" the recommendations on four claims included in the third instalment for serious personal injuries on behalf of persons that are asserted to be still in detention in Iraq, or for death claims filed for "missing persons." No award of compensation is recommended at this stage for these claims. 11/

III. APPLICATION OF ARTICLE 41 OF THE RULES12/

21. The Panel was informed by the secretariat that some computational errors had occurred in the amounts awarded for claims covered in previous reports. The Panel noted that the secretariat had reexamined all claims concerned and submitted to it corrected figures. The Panel recommends that the amounts in 10 consolidated claim submissions be rectified as follows:

22. The correct amounts for individual claims in the 10 consolidated claim submissions are specified in the annexes that are being provided separately to the Government or international organization concerned. The Panel recommends that the difference in amounts resulting from the computational errors in the previous reports be added to or subtracted from the total amounts awarded to each of the Governments concerned with respect to the claims covered in this fourth report.
